Natacha Sautereau is an agro-economist. She has been studying organic systems for more than twenty years. She firstly worked with group of farmers, who made organic trials, and she was in charge of formations to help conventional farmers to convert to organic (Chamber of agriculture, Provence). Then she worked at INRA as a research engineer on the compromises in organic performances (Sautereau et al., 2010), and on the transitions towards organic using the Multi-Level Perspective model (Sautereau et al., 2012). She is used to work with inter-disciplinary teams of researchers, on the plurality of approaches from agronomists, economists, and sociologists (Sautereau et al., 2013). More recently she was co-leading a large national study aiming at quantifying and giving economic values to externalities provided in organic systems in comparison with conventional ones (Sautereau et al., 2016).
